On 7 January 2023 wildfires broke out in multiple areas of Los Angeles County, California, USA. At least 27 people were reported killed, and thousands were forced to evacuate their homes following a series of blazes that burned uncontrollably, fanned by strong winds. Due to the ongoing fires and hazardous air quality, a number of higher educational institutions announced temporary campus closures or limited operations, including the California Institute of Technology, Pomona College and the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA). Around 15,000 structures have been reported destroyed, including the Palmdale branch of the Los Angeles Public Library. Numerous other structures sustained damage, including the Malibu Library of the Los Angeles County Library system and outdoor installations of the Getty Villa museum. The fires also destroyed a work-in-progress that had been commissioned for the 2028 re-opening of the expanded Los Angeles County Museum of Art. Meanwhile, UCLA and other colleges in southern California have donated space for Disaster Recovery Centers, while student volunteers are involved in providing essentials to the displaced.
