# The challenge of Alt Text - generating accessible images - the current state and future possibilities.

An update for accessibility professionals, publishers and librarians interested in accessibility.

June 5, 2024, 12:00 CEST

Join us for an inspiring discussion on "Beyond Visibility: Improving Accessibility in Images", a webinar designed to delve deeper into the principles of accessibility in digital content, with particular attention to images and enabling access to all, including people with visual disabilities.

In web language, the term ALT Text indicates an alternative description and is useful for facilitating reading by screen readers, i.e. devices used by people who are visually impaired or have severe vision problems. Through identifying text on the computer, they can reproduce it through speech synthesis or a braille display. Thus, the function of ALT Text is to precisely describe what is illustrated in a photo in the text and is not a simple cut and paste of the caption.

The webinar will address key topics, such as the essential elements of ALT Text; the importance of descriptive captions and the use of AI-assisted technologies to improve the accessibility of content. Also taken into consideration will be the advantages and disadvantages currently under discussion within the accessibility community regarding the adoption of Artificial Intelligence in the description of images.

As part of the promotion of the theme of accessibility which Cenfor has been following since 2013, and in harmony with the guidelines of the 2030 Agenda, we have invited experts who will contribute to an update on this topic.

The webinar is aimed at the documentation sector, publishers, librarians and academic, research and government bodies all of which will have to comply by June 2025 to the EAA.
